**MSc Scheme** – The Local Authority Public Health Research Network (LAPHRN), in London North Thames is part of a 'network of networks' across the country in public health. Similar networks have been developed in other regions such as East of England, who are the leader of networks of networks. In a recent meeting in the East of England region, the Academy of Medical Sciences published a policy update (Sept 2023) was highlighted. It identifies four priority areas for actions:

- Invest in health of the public research and practice through cross government and cross agency working to build an effective, evidence based and integrated public health system.
- Harness data and novel methods and technologies for health of public research and practice.
- Facilitate the use of health evidence for all policies.
- Develop the next generation of public health researchers and practitioners.

These changes are the aims of the LAPHRN but aim to draw on this more thoroughly in and out of this network.
